1. Bokra Sawa

This year Bokra Sawa organises an international meeting between young Euro-Mediterranean countries: France, Sweden, Tunisia and Egypt. During this exchange, participants will document the situation of gender equality in their country by sharing their experiences and stories and they will contribute to bringing solutions, at the local level, to reduce gender inequalities and thus tackling the subsequent social exclusion. Bokra Sawa – in cooperation with EIMadina for Performing and Digital Arts, Fanni Raghman Anni, and National Museums of World Culture – invite you to visit the exhibition. Proceeding from the exhibition, the field trip will offer a workshop on gender equality and discuss with you Bokra Sawa's work and the experiences made during the setting up of the international meeting and the exhibition as well as potential prospects of this project.

During the Field Trip you will get an insight into the work of Eurocircle and meet some of its volunteers. The subjects covered will concern Europe and citizenship in general as well as democratic tools in the EU with a particular view on the European elections. You will discover information on petitions, citizen initiatives and consultations for the European elections. Together, we will also test methods of animation in connection with these topics but also in connection with the collection of recommendations from citizens.
